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NOAA SCIENTISTS CONTINUE NATIONWIDE LECTURE SERIES ON ACOUSTIC IMPACTS ON MARINE MAMMALS

NOAA Fisheries Service and scientists from various academic institutions are sponsoring a free national lecture series on marine mammals and human noise. They will hold the fourteenth and fifteenth lectures at Duke University in Durham, NC on April 24, 2006 and Duke University Marine Laboratory in Beaufort, NC on April 25, 2006.

NOAA Fisheries Service Acoustics Program and other scientific experts in marine mammals and human noise hosted 13 lectures at public aquariums and marine laboratories around the country during 2004, to help increase public knowledge about human noise and marine mammals. The lecture series, Understanding Acoustic Impacts on Marine Animals, continues this month with the first lecture in almost two years.
